Themed “**Enhancing Sustainable Development in a Pandemic World**”, the CleanEnviro Summit Singapore (CESG) Catalyst 2021 took place on 29 September 2021 at Sands Expo and Convention Centre, Singapore, in partnership with Temasek’s Ecosperity Week.






