This pandemic has turned the spotlight on the use of Al-enabled robots for the cleaning of offices, factories and public spaces to raise hygiene standards and protect the well-being of the community. To keep up with the demands brought on by the pandemic, improvements had to be made to improve the robots' 3D mapping and location awareness capabilities to enable them to follow more precise routes, increase efficiency and reduce resource consumption.

Whiz is a product of SoftBank Robotics. Gambit is a product of Avalon Robotics, a joint venture with SoftBank Robotics Group. SoftBank Robotics Group has led the way with Whiz, an autonomous floor-care robot programmed to perform indoor navigation and thorough vacuum cleaning. Efficient and costeffective, Whiz is easy to set up and can detect and avoid obstacles such as human beings, glass walls and steps via multiple built-in sensors. In addition, Whiz can cover a large area and be controlled remotely. In partnership with Avalon SteriTech, an innovative disinfectant spraying device named Gambit was developed specifically for Whiz, allowing the combined approach to clean and disinfect areas in one go. Using approved disinfectants, Whiz Gambit applies unique dry-mist technology to generate <10 micron particles to uniformly bio-decontaminate target areas. SoftBank Robotics continues to innovate and customise the robot and add-ons, so that it stays ahead in catering to evolving needs.

## **NEA Grant Call**



NEA has partnered Enterprise Singapore to launch a Grant Call, seeking solutions that will automate the collection and pre-processing of soiled crockery for centralised dishwashing (CDW).

Although tray collection is automated at some hawker centres, food courts and F&B establishments in Singapore, the design of each Automated Tray Return System differs, and substantial manpower is still required to preprocess the crockery for CDW, such as sorting and stacking crockery and cutlery.

We are seeking ideas that can raise productivity for the collection and pre-processing of soiled crockery, for both offsite and onsite CDW at hawker centres, food courts and F&B establishments. Up to 80% co-funding support is available to fast-track the development of your solution! The deadline for submission is on 5 May 2021. Learn more here.

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
## **Exhibitor**

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






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
