While India features prominently, the rest of South Asia moves on par, with impressive urban growth rates. Governments in Afghanistan, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Maldives and Pakistan also grapple with increasing urban demands while trying to generate opportunities from this urban challenge. While the world's attention gravitates to India, prospects are also abundant for those willing to venture deeper into South Asia. This session brings the attention to the openings for global urban solutions providers to play a role in the growth and urbanisation of South Asian cities.
